Each year, SJC graduates are asked to complete a survey about their transition to a career and provide details about their current (or soon to be) position. Surveys are sent beginning about a month prior to graduation, with reminders sent every two weeks until a month after graduation. Two final reminders are sent in September to those who have not replied.

Prior to 2019, SJC partnered with GradLeaders to administer "The Outcomes Survey." For 2021, we administered the "First Destination Survey" provided by our partner, Handshake.

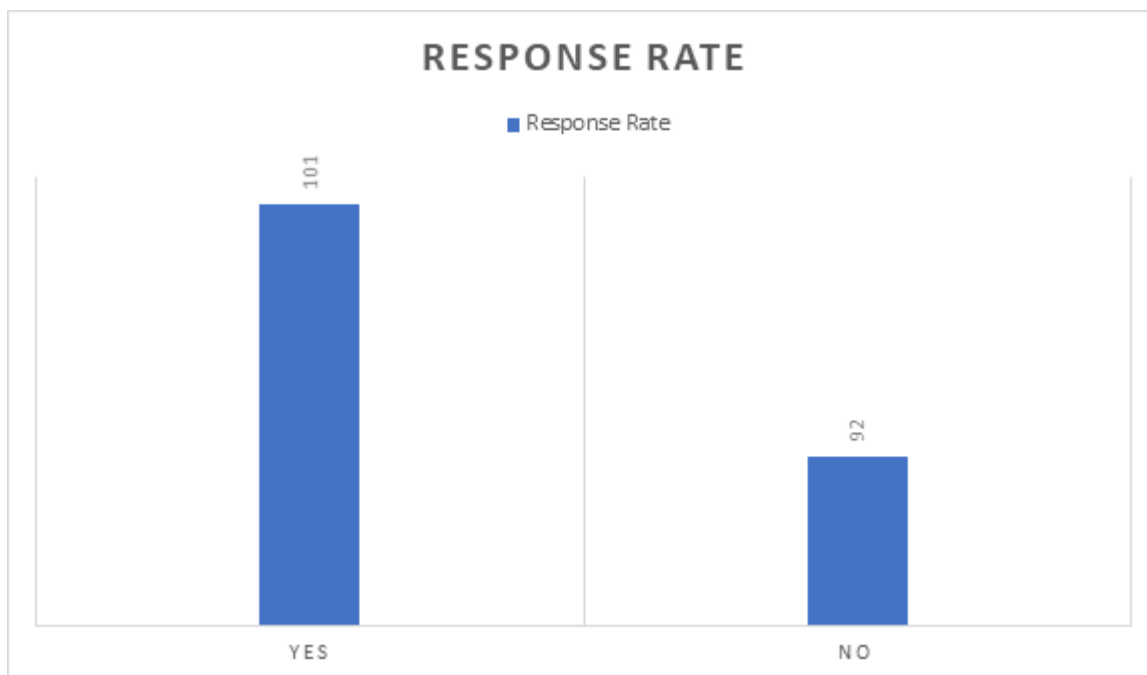

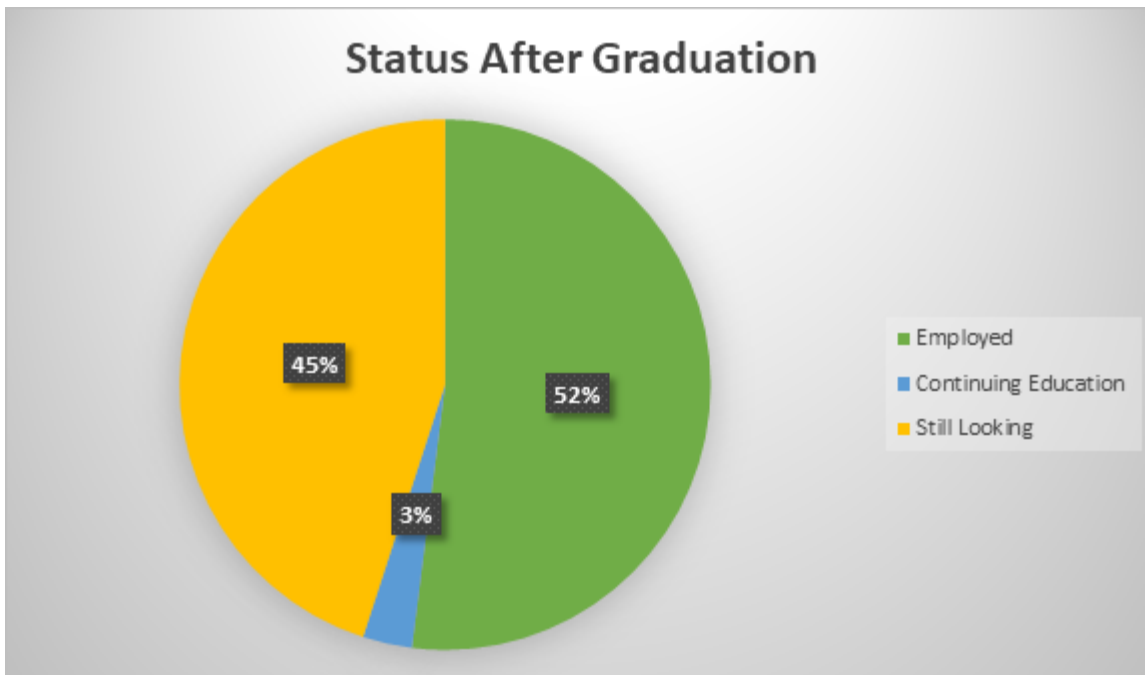
Saint Joseph's College Class of 2021

Median Starting Salary = \$55,000

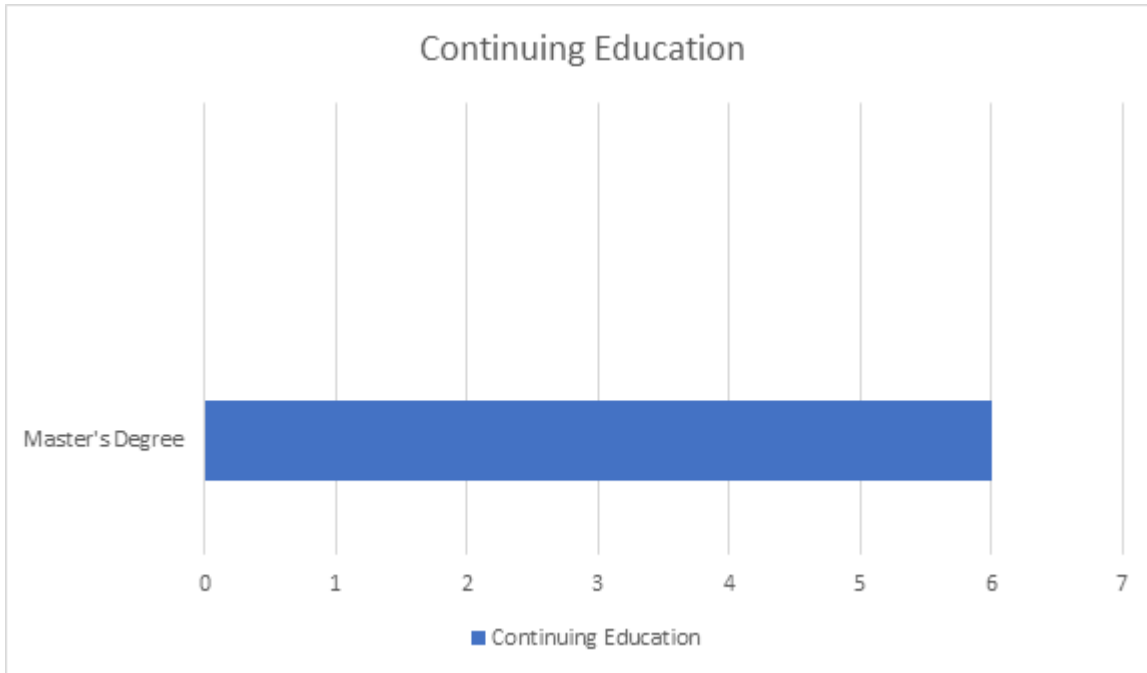
